Understanding Patrick Star: Key Features and Proportions

To succeed at **How To Draw Patrick From Spongebob**, you need to understand what makes Patrick look like himself. He is not just any starfish. Here

are the key characteristics to keep in mind:

- **Body Shape:** Patrick has a large, rounded, pear-like body. He is wider at the bottom and slightly narrower at the top. Think of a soft, squishy shape.
- **Head:** His head is not separate from his body. Instead, the top of his body forms his head. He has no neck.
- **Eyes:** Patrick has large, round eyes that are set wide apart. They are white with small black pupils. His eyelids are usually half-closed, giving him a sleepy, laid-back expression.
- **Nose:** His nose is a simple, elongated oval that points upward.

It sits between his eyes.

- **Mouth:** Patrick has a wide, goofy grin that stretches almost from ear to ear (though he does not have visible ears). His mouth is often open, showing a few teeth and a tongue.
- **Arms and Legs:** He has five limbs in total, like a starfish, but they are soft and fleshy. Two arms on the sides, two legs at the bottom, and one small point at the top of his head (the top of the star). His arms and legs are stubby and rounded.
- **Clothing:** Patrick wears green shorts with purple flowers. The shorts are his most distinctive accessory.
- **Color:** His body is a warm, bright pink. His shorts are light green,

and the flowers are purple.

Keeping these features in mind will help you as you follow the step-by-step instructions. Now, let us begin.

Step 1: Drawing the Basic Shapes for Patrick Star

The first stage of **How To Draw Patrick From Spongebob** involves laying down the foundation. Do not worry about details yet. We are going to use simple geometric shapes to map out his body.

Start by drawing a large, slightly flattened oval in the center of your

paper. This oval represents Patrick's body. Make it a bit wider at the bottom than at the top, like an egg lying on its side. Do not press too hard with your pencil. You want these lines to be light so you can erase them later.

Next, draw a smaller, horizontal oval near the top of the large oval. This will be the area for his eyes and face. This guide shape does not need to be perfect. It is just there to help you place his features correctly.

Now, add two small circles on either side of the large oval for his arms. They should be positioned about halfway down the body. For his legs, draw two small ovals at the bottom of the large oval. His legs point outward slightly, like a duck's feet. Finally, add a tiny triangle or small point at the very top of the large

oval. This is the top point of Patrick's starfish body.

At this stage, your drawing should look like a collection of simple shapes. That is perfectly fine. You are building a framework. Take a moment to check the proportions. Is the body too wide? Are the arms and legs balanced? Adjust anything that looks off before moving on.

Step 2: Refining the Body and Adding the Head

Shape

Now that you have your basic shapes, it is time to refine them. This is the second phase of **How To Draw Patrick From Spongebob**. Start by connecting the shapes with smooth, curved lines. Patrick's body is continuous and organic, so avoid harsh angles.

Draw a curved line from the top point down the left side of the body, connecting to the left arm, then down to the left leg. Repeat on the right side. You are essentially creating a smooth outline that incorporates all the limbs. The arms and legs should look like natural extensions of the body, not separate pieces stuck on.

His head is simply the upper portion of

the body. Draw a gentle curve across the upper area to separate the face from the body. This line does not need to be perfectly straight. In fact, a slight curve gives him more personality. Erase any unnecessary guide lines from the first step so that you have a clean, continuous outline.

Take a look at your drawing now. You should be able to see Patrick's general silhouette. He is chubby, round, and friendly. If something looks uneven, now is the time to fix it. Use your eraser and redraw as needed.

Step 3: Drawing

Patrick's Eyes and Nose

The face is the most important part of any character drawing. When learning **How To Draw Patrick From Spongebob**, getting the eyes and nose right is crucial because they carry so much of his personality.

Start with the eyes. Draw two large circles in the upper portion of the face area. They should be well-separated, with plenty of space between them for the nose. The eyes are not perfectly round. They are slightly wider than they are tall, giving Patrick his cheerful, relaxed look.

Inside each eye, draw a smaller circle for the iris. Patrick's pupils are black and relatively small. Place them in the center of each iris. Then, add a tiny white highlight in each pupil. This little dot makes his eyes look lively and shiny.

Now, for the eyelids. Patrick often has half-closed eyelids that make him look sleepy or unbothered. Draw a curved line across the top of each eye to represent the eyelid. The curve should dip down slightly in the middle. This gives him that classic goofy expression.

Between the eyes, draw Patrick's nose. It is an upright, elongated oval. The tip of the nose is slightly wider than the base. It should point upward, almost touching the top of the face area. The nose is one of Patrick's most distinctive features, so take your time with it.

Erase any overlapping lines from the face area. You should now have a clean, recognizable Patrick face.

Step 4: Adding Patrick's Smile and Mouth Details

Patrick's smile is wide, warm, and slightly mischievous. To continue with **How To Draw Patrick From Spongebob**, draw a large, curved line that starts near the left side of his face and arcs all the way to the right side. The curve should be a simple U-shape,

but very wide. The ends of the smile should go almost to the edges of his body.

Inside the mouth, add a few details. Draw a small, curved line for his tongue at the bottom of the mouth. Then, add a few small, rounded teeth at the top. Patrick usually has two or three teeth visible. They are simple, small rectangles or ovals. Do not overcomplicate this part. The charm of Patrick's smile is in its simplicity.

On the sides of his face, just above the ends of his smile, add two small dimples or cheek lines. These are short, curved lines that make his smile look even bigger and more genuine.

Finally, draw two small, curved lines above his eyes for his eyebrows. Patrick

does not always show eyebrows, but adding them can enhance his expression. For a happy, relaxed look, keep the eyebrows gently arched.

Step 5: Drawing Patrick's Shorts and Clothing

Patrick Star is almost always seen wearing his signature green shorts with purple flowers. This step in **How To Draw Patrick From Spongebob** is where you add his iconic outfit.

Draw a horizontal line across the lower part of his body to create the waistband of the shorts. The line should be slightly

curved, following the roundness of his body. Then, draw another curved line a short distance below the first one to show the bottom edge of the shorts. The shorts are quite short, like athletic shorts.

Now, add the legs. Patrick's legs are short, stubby, and slightly tapered. They come out from under the shorts. Draw two small, rounded shapes for his feet. His feet are simple and do not have toes. They are just soft, rounded stumps.

For the flowers on the shorts, draw a few small, simple flower shapes. Each flower usually has five petals. They are scattered randomly across the green fabric. The flowers are purple or a dark pink. You can draw them as simple circles with small dots in the center, or as actual five-petal flowers. Keep them

small and simple so they do not overwhelm the design.

Step 6: Adding the Arms, Hands, and Star Points

Patrick's arms are one of his most endearing features. In this part of **How To Draw Patrick From Spongebob**, we will give them definition and add the star points.

His arms are short, thick, and taper to a rounded point. They do not have fingers or hands in the traditional sense. Instead, each arm ends in a small, blunt point. From
