If your router broadcasts a 5 GHz signal only, or if the 2.4 GHz band is disabled, the thermostat will not see it. Log into your router's administration panel and enable the 2.4 GHz band. Alternatively, temporarily disable the 5 GHz band during setup. Once the thermostat is connected, you can re-enable the 5 GHz band for other devices.

Password Rejected Despite Correct Entry

WiFi passwords are case-sensitive. Double-check that you have entered uppercase and lowercase letters correctly. Also, ensure there are no trailing spaces. If you are copying and pasting the

password, make sure no extra characters are included. Some Honeywell models have a show password option that allows you to verify what you have typed.

Thermostat Connects but Shows Offline in the App

This issue often indicates that the thermostat can reach your WiFi network but cannot communicate with Honeywell's cloud servers. Check your router's firewall settings to ensure that outbound connections on ports 80 and 443 are not blocked. Additionally, verify that your internet connection is active by testing another device. If the problem continues, power cycle your router by unplugging it for 30 seconds and then plugging it back in.

TIPS FOR A SMOOTH HONEYWELL THERMOSTAT WIFI CONFIGURATION
