DAY 3: SHOULDERS AND ABS

2. **Side Lateral Raises:** 4 sets of 12-15 reps

5. **Abs: Hanging Leg Raises, Cable Crunches, Planks, and Russian Twists** – performed in a circuit, 3-4 rounds without rest.

Shoulders are particularly susceptible to injury, so the **LL Cool J Platinum Workout** stresses using lighter weights for lateral raises and focusing on form.

DAY 4: LEGS (THE FOUNDATION)

LL Cool J has always emphasized that "legs are the foundation of a champion." He works his lower body with high volume:

1. **Barbell Back Squats (or Front Squats):** 4 sets of 8-10 reps
2. **Leg Press (varying foot positions):** 4 sets of 12-15 reps
3. **Romanian Deadlifts (for hamstrings):** 3 sets of 10-12 reps
4. **Walking Lunges (with dumbbells):** 3 sets of 12 steps per leg
5. **Leg Extensions and Leg Curls (supersetted):** 3 sets of 15 reps each
6. **Calf Raises (standing and seated):** 4 sets of 15-20 reps each

The leg day is grueling. The **LL Cool J Platinum Workout** suggests listening to high-energy music and pushing through the discomfort, as it releases growth hormone and supports overall muscle development.

Cardio and Conditioning in the Platinum Plan
