MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS TO APPLY

Basic Qualifications for Sworn Officers

1. **Age:** Must be at least 19 years old at the time of application.
2. **Citizenship:** Must be a U.S. citizen.
3. **Education:** A high school diploma or GED is required. An associate's or bachelor's degree is preferred and can make you a more competitive candidate.
4. **Driver's License:** A valid Florida driver's license at the time of hire.
5. **Criminal History:** No felony convictions. Misdemeanor history will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis. Domestic violence convictions are disqualifying.
6. **Background Check:** Successful completion of an extensive background investigation, including credit check, drug screening, and psychological evaluation.
7. **Physical Fitness:** Must

pass a physical agility test (PAT) and maintain fitness throughout your career.

THE HIRING AND APPLICATION PROCESS FOR MDPD CAREERS

Step 6: Psychological Evaluation

A licensed psychologist will assess your mental fitness for the stresses of police work. This includes written personality tests and a clinical interview.

Step 7: Medical Examination

A comprehensive physical exam, including vision and hearing tests, drug screening, and overall health assessment.

Step 8: Oral Board Interview

A panel of command staff will ask scenario-based questions to evaluate your judgment, communication skills,

and decision-making under pressure.

Offer and Academy Enrollment

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Successful candidates receive a conditional employment offer and are scheduled for the next available **Miami Dade police training academy class**.

TRAINING AT THE MDPD ACADEMY: WHAT TO EXPECT

Graduates of the academy earn their Florida Law Enforcement Certification and begin their field training with a senior officer.
